## M. Louise Gloeckner, M.D., Summer Research Fellowship

### INFORMATION SHEET

Research proposals must delineate the use that will be made of the collections. Research projects must focus on materials in the Archives and Special Collections, though other collections in the Philadelphia area may be utilized as well. A short essay summarizing research findings is required upon completion of the fellowship. This essay may be published in a University publication or online via the Archives website.

The Fellowship award for Summer 2017 is \$4,000. This fellowship is to be used for research in residence at the Archives and Special Collections on Women in Medicine, to begin on or after June 1, 2017 and to extend for no less than 4-6 weeks.

The deadline for applications is March 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2017. Please do not leave any blank spaces on the application: answer all questions completely. The recipient will be notified and the award announced by May 2017.

## M. Louise Gloeckner, M.D., Summer Research Fellowship

### APPLICATION PROCEDURES

#### **Purpose**

This program was established in memory of M. Louise Carpenter Gloeckner, M.D. by her husband Frederick Gloeckner in recognition of her key leadership roles in the medical profession. This is a competitive annual fellowship open to scholars, students and general researchers.

The program was established to encourage the use of the institution's archival collections. In addition to materials related to the history of Woman's Medical College/Medical College of Pennsylvania, the collections have particular strengths in the history of women in medicine, nursing, medical missionaries, and the American Medical Women's Association. The grant award of \$4,000 is available for 4-6 weeks of research at the Archives and Special Collections on Women in Medicine for a well-defined project.

#### **Review Considerations**

Proposals will be evaluated by an Advisory Committee. The following criteria will be considered:

- \* Research background of the applicant
- \* Relevance of the proposed research project to the goals of the applicant
- \* Overall quality and clarity of the proposal
- \* Appropriateness of the proposal to the holdings of the collection
- \* Commitment of the applicant to the project

#### **Specific Instructions for the Applicant**

The earliest possible start date for the fellowship is June 2017.

#### Educational Information:

Applicant's Education: List all degree programs beginning with baccalaureate or other initial professional education. Include all dates (month and year) of degrees received or expected, in addition to other information requested.

Applicant's Training/Employment: List in chronological order all non-degree training, including postdoctoral work and all employment after college. Applicants should include information on internships, assistantships and any specialty certification (actual and anticipated with dates) in addition to other information requested.

Goals for Fellowship: Explain goals of research under this fellowship and the relevance to your future career goals. Identify areas of investigation, theories, conceptual approaches, etc. that you hope to learn or enhance your understanding of during the fellowship. Describe how the proposed research will contribute to future work and the achievement of your career goals.

Abstract: State the broad objectives and specific aims of the research proposal, making reference to the collection's relatedness to this project. Describe concisely the research plan of work and methods for achieving these goals. This should serve as a succinct and accurate description of the proposed work when separated from the application.

### **Background - Application form**

Support: Follow instructions on form.

Academic and Professional Honors: List any honors that would reflect upon your potential for a fellowship. Include current memberships in professional societies.

Title(s) of Thesis/Dissertations(s): Self-explanatory. Thesis advisor or Chief of Service should submit a reference. If this person does not, please explain.

Supplement: List any plans developed to supplement the stipend.

### **Research Experience**

- a. Summary Summarize in chronological order your research experience, including the problems studied and conclusions. Specify which problems were theses. If you have no research experience, list other related experience. Do not list academic courses. Do not exceed one page.
- b. Doctoral Dissertation (*if applicable*) Summarize, not exceeding one page.
- c. Publications In chronological order, list your entire bibliography, separating abstracts, book chapters, reviews and research papers.

### **Research Proposal and Plan**

This section should be well formulated and presented in sufficient detail that it can be evaluated for both its research potential and its scholarly merit. Please include:

- a. Specific Aims State the specific area of study, its purpose and the thesis to be argued.
- b. Background and Significance Briefly outline the background to the plan. State concisely the importance of the research described by relating the specific aims to broad, long-term objectives.
- c. Research Design and Methods
- d. Literature Citations

**Submitting Your Application:**

1. A full application includes:
  - a. Application form
  - b. Research Experience
  - c. Research Plan and Proposal
  - d. Two letters of recommendation from persons competent to comment on your research abilities. Medical students may submit a general letter of support.
